Mason Tops U.S. News List of Schools to Watch



Mason was named the nation's number one university to watch on U.S. News and World Report's new list of "Up-and-Coming Schools" published on Friday, Aug. 22.

The list, comprising 70 colleges and universities across the country, identifies "schools that have recently made the most promising and innovative changes in academics, faculty, students, campus or facilities."

In its annual peer assessment survey, U.S. News asked education experts to identify schools that met those criteria. This is the first time a list of up-and-coming schools has been created.

"Being recognized by U.S. News & World Report for this is both an honor and validation of our efforts," says Mason President Alan Merten. "This acknowledgment is something that every one of our faculty, staff, students and alumni should be proud of." (Mason Gazette, 8/22/08)

In a survey conducted by the Chronicle of Higher Education, the premier publication for academic news and issues, Mason was named as one of the "Great Colleges to Work For" in 10 different categories. In the survey results, Mason joins the ranks of universities such as Emory and Stanford as having the best practices and polices in these categories:

- Healthy faculty-administration relations
- Work-Life Balance: Policies give employees the flexibility to manage their personal lives.
- Internal Communications: Ideas are fully considered and issues debated for better results.
- Connection to Institution and Pride: Employees have a strong sense of loyalty to the institution.



- Supervisor or Department Chair Relationship: Supervisor makes expectations clear and solicits ideas.
- Perception and Confidence in Fair Treatment: Confidence in fair treatment, particularly regarding compensation and performance.
- Respect and Appreciation: Employees are regularly recognized for contributions.
- Policies, Resources, and Efficiency: Institution is well run and prepares employees to be effective.
- Engagement Index: The emotional connection employees have to an organization.
